Women's Book Group will meet Thursday, January 20, at 7:00 p.m. in the French Memorial to discuss Galileo's Daughter by Dava Sobel.

"Galileo Galilei's telescopes allowed him to discover a new reality in the heavens. But for publicly declaring his astounding argument—that the earth revolves around the sun—he was accused of heresy and put under house arrest by the Holy Office of the Inquisition. Living a far different life, Galileo's daughter Virginia, a cloistered nun, proved to be her father's greatest source of strength through the difficult years of his trial and persecution.

Drawing upon the remarkable surviving letters that Virginia wrote to her father, Dava Sobel has written a fascinating history of Medici-era Italy, a mesmerizing account of Galileo's scientific discoveries and his trial by Church authorities, and a touching portrayal of a father-daughter relationship. *Galileo's Daughter* is a profoundly moving portrait of the man who forever changed the way we see the universe."

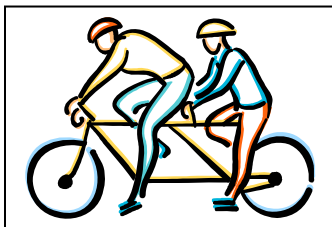

The Green Corner – Stewardship of the Environment

As Paula Fines, our "green" representative to the Diocese, reported in last month's issue, the environmental team is putting together an application for a Green Grant. Using a great template created by David Cameron, Paula assembled and submitted 47 (!) pages of required documentation. Additional material, including our specific proposal, will be sent to the Diocese in the next two months. Projects currently being considered for the grant include:

- replacement windows in parts of the Parish Hall and French Memorial
- solar panels
- tankless hot water heating
- devices (ceiling fans, convection units) to reduce oil consumption for heating the Parish Hall basement.

- **St. Paul's cost was 20% below the average, and we are resolved to do better still!**

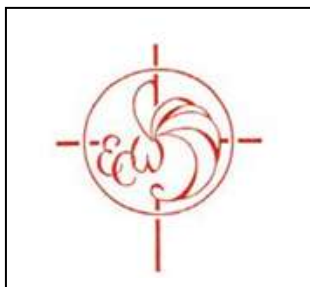

Finance Committee News

The revenue and expense for November and the first eleven months appear below. During the month

funds provided by the Faire were recorded and operating revenue exceeded expense by \$2,152. The budget shortfall for the year to date is \$(39,703). The budget shortfall for the full year is expected to be about \$(45,000).

The Vestry has adopted a budget for the first three months of 2011 with a commitment to continue the budget discussions. Total revenues are expected to be up slightly. Total disbursements as budgeted will increase to a lesser degree. The Vestry has pared expense in a few areas to try narrow the continuing deficit. Some of the items funded in the 2010 budget that have been removed or reduced in the 2011 budget include the Rector's Discretionary Fund, Visiting Organist, Office and Janitor Supplies, Property Repair and Advertising. More details on the 1st quarter budget will be available at the Annual Meeting.

Education For Ministry

Those cold winter evenings are an ideal time for reading, study, and reflection. Perhaps this is the year to add a new avenue for expanding your knowledge of scripture and exploring your own life as ministry.

Education for Ministry (EFM) groups meet once a week over the course of a nine-month academic year to study, pray, and reflect on their own beliefs in relationship to our culture and the traditions of our Christian faith. EFM is a worldwide program developed by the School of Theology of The University of the South. The program is not specific to the Episcopal Church so all are welcome to explore this program of theological reflection. Our current group consists of members from Christ Church and South Church and meets at South Church.

There are four EFM courses offered over four years, with participants committing to participate one year at a time. Participants can earn 18 CEU per year.

Year 1: Old Testament
 Year 2: New Testament
 Year 3: Church History
 Year 4: Theological Choices
