Watch With Christ

The night before his crucifixion, Christ prayed in the Garden of Gethsemane and asked his disciples to stay awake with him. He knew it was to be his last night. Yet three times his disciples fell asleep and three times Jesus had to wake him. They were unable to stand by him during his anguish. After falling asleep the third time, Judas the betrayer appeared in the garden with armed men to arrest Jesus. From there he was lead to his trial and crucifixion.

As Christians, we are asked to watch with Christ in our daily lives. To be awake to our Christian faith, responsibilities, and grace in all we do.

This Holy Week you will have the chance to stay awake with Christ at St. Paul's. The church will be open all night from Maundy Thursday (April 9) until Good Friday (April 10). We will invite people to sign up for a one-hour time slot in which to come to the church to pray, so that Jesus may not be unattended during the night. In addition to praying, you may bring a book or a journal or some sort of spiritual reading material. Other materials will be supplied as well. While it may sound crazy in the light of day, some of the most profound encounters one may have with God will be at 3:00 a.m. Praying in the church in the middle of the night is a moving activity.

A sign up sheet will be found in the parish hall beginning on Sunday, March 29th. Friends may sign up together, and so may families, but please try to fill in all the available slots throughout the night and the next morning. This is a rewarding spiritual activity and I encourage you to try it.

New Format For Palm Sunday

This year we are trying something new. Instead of having Palm Sunday celebrate both Palm Sunday and the crucifixion in one service, Palm Sunday will be a celebration of Jesus' arrival in Jerusalem and of his teachings and actions on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday of Holy Week. These days are a summary of the core of Jesus' ministry during his life. To hear the story of the crucifixion, you will need to come to church on Good Friday. We will have two services on Friday, at noon and 7:30pm, so that you will find time to attend one. We are experimenting with this slight rearrangement because it seems that we lose the (continued on next page)

Finance Committee News

The summary budget report through February is shown below. The report shows that our expenses exceeded our income by about \$13,000 for the month. The increased expense in the month included some utility

bills and diocesan assessment "catch up" and significant snow removal expenses as well as a quarterly pension payment that was made.

The Finance Committee is very grateful for all of you who made a pledge to St. Paul's and those who are able to pay the pledge on a timely basis. Cash flow is a major concern as we work through this year's budget and the receipt of pledges on time or even ahead of time is a tremendous help.

As we as a congregation, and we as individuals deal with the realities of the current economy, we are all looking for ways to do more with less. It is a time to think more seriously about the "in kind" donations we can make that would benefit each other, St. Paul's and the greater community. Let us know of your needs and ideas.
