Sackcloth and Ashes?

In the early church, baptisms were done only once a year, at Easter. Candidates for baptism had to engage in a rigorous three-year preparation for the event: study, fasting, repentance, and prayer. It became the custom that this preparation reached its pinnacle during the 40 days prior to this Easter baptism. Over time those who were already Christians thought it might be a good thing if they joined in with those who were preparing for baptism and spend some time every year engaging in those same activities. They chose to join them in those final 40 days. These days became known as Lent, a period of fasting, self-examination and repentance. These hard days of preparation make the joy of Easter all that more sweet!

But there is a variety of responses people have to Lent ranging from the deep penance of sackcloth and ashes -- to indifference. I don't suggest either of the extremes. I do suggest using this time as a gift. It is a gift to renew our efforts at a steady prayer life. It is a gift to engage in self-examination and repentance. Such endeavors release us from the pain of faults we carry with us. It is a gift to spend a day fasting and hungering for the word of God. It is a gift to do things which draw us closer to Christ. It is a gift to have a time every year to remind us to do these things.

In addition to your personal Lenten disciplines, St. Paul's has some community Lenten offerings. We will continue with our annual Wednesday suppers with Faith Lutheran. We will offer two family spiritual gatherings after church on March 7 & 21. The schedule for both the suppers and gatherings is listed inside the Apostle. We will also hand out "From Fear to Love, Lenten Reflections on the Parable of the Prodigal Son", a Lenten book of meditations by Henri Nouwen, to all who are interested.

Birthday in a Box

The Outreach Committee is pleased to offer you an opportunity, for the month of March, to share your blessings with the kids at the Hancock Courts after-school and summer program, "Manos Felices!" ~ "Happy Hands" at Hancock!, by participating in a monthly project called "Birthday in a Box."

Most of us have happy memories of our childhood birthdays. But many of the children attending the program have never had a birthday party or cake. Imagine a child having to watch his or her birthday come and go, with no celebration to mark the day.

The Outreach Committee will provide a sheet cake and Hoodsie Cups, we are requesting donations of the following; paper plates, napkins, plastic forks, juice boxes, balloons (in a bag, not inflated), and one other party item (not to exceed the cost of \$1 per child), such as a party favor, one box of birthday candles, two plastic table covers (for 6 foot rectangular tables) and two large garbage bags. The number of children attending the Hancock Courts program varies from approximately 50 to 70 depending on the time of year; they range in age from preschool to grade five.

Additionally, Cradles to Crayons, an organization that provides those children with back-to-school backpacks and other items, provides birthday gifts for each child between the ages of 3 and 13. There are three children turning 14 to 17 years old during March, it is also requested that we

donate a \$10.00 McDonald's Gift Certificate for each of those children.

Of Keys and Locks

Over the next months some of the locks around St. Paul's will be changed. You might be surprised to

learn that there are 22 lockable doors around the property and 14 different keys! There is a joke around the parish that half of North Andover probably has keys to our church. It seems time to get a bit more control over distribution of quality keys.

Some locks like the church front door and the parish hall door just don't work well anymore and need to be replaced. Other locks are being changed or added for improved security - Stephanie's office, the sacristy, and the organ compartment. We are also slowly moving to a master key system so some locks will be changed to upgrade them to the master system. We will shortly have a key safe with original keys in it and will stop the practice of making copies of copies which reduces the quality of the keys. Any new key will be made directly from the original. During this transitional period, Bob Zimmerman or Paula Fines should be contacted for new or replacement keys.

We appreciate your patience while these changes take place. Everyone who needs keys will be able to get them but we will now have a record of who has what keys. Anyone given a key will be asked to not copy it and to return it when no longer needed.

It's nearly time for United Thank Offering. Yes, the little boxes are back. We in ECW hope to get them to you by the beginning of March.

Founded and administered by women since 1889, UTO is a program that supports the missions of the Episcopal Church, using money collected in the parishes to provide grants to churches and neighborhoods. Some of the past efforts include:

- In 2005, a Boys & Girls Club in remote and impoverished Terligua, Texas was able to buy a van to transport young members.
- In 2007, St. Matthew's in Raytown, Missouri was able to offer a state-of-the-art English as a Second Language learning center for adults to serve its growing Hispanic population.
- In 2008, St. Mark the Evangelist in Lavender Hill, a township created during apartheid in South Africa, worked with UTO Lazarus Project to build a new parish center.
- Emery Hall and Bromley Mission, a girl's school in Liberia was founded in 1904 and is still running today. It was established and maintained with UTO money.

UTO states its vision, "We will significantly impact the lives of women and children because of Christ's love. To achieve this vision we will focus particularly on projects that implement significant change toward alleviating profound human suffering that the Millennium Development Goals address . . ."




